EXEMPTIONS

Exemptions: Authorised practitioners are exempt from the requirements in subclauses 35(2A), (2B), (3) and (4) and 80(2), (3) and (4) of the Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Regulation 2008 when issuing a prescription using an electronic medication order chart system approved under the National Health (Electronic National Residential Medication Chart Trial) Special Arrangement 2018 ("Special Arrangement").

1. Condition

The prescription must be issued for a person receiving residential care using an electronic medication order chart system:

- a) At an approved residential care service specified in the Schedule to the Special Arrangement, or
- b) Listed on the Transitional eNRMC Conformance Register maintained by the Australian Digital Health Agency.


2. Duration

Exemptions: Pharmacists are exempt from compliance with the requirements in the Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Regulation 2008 ("Regulation") specified below when supplying Schedule 2 substances, Schedule 3 substances, restricted substances and/or drugs of addiction in accordance with the order of an authorised practitioner made using an electronic medication order chart system approved under the National Health (Electronic National Residential Medication Chart Trial) Special Arrangement 2018 ("Special Arrangement").

1. Exemptions

Subclause 19(2):

Exemption from the requirement in subclause 19(1) for a pharmacist to endorse a prescription for the supply of a Schedule 2 or 3 substance.

Subclause 39(4):

Exemption from the requirement in subclause 39(1), insofar as it requires a pharmacist to only dispense a restricted substance on prescription if the form of the prescription complies with the requirements in subclauses 35(2A), (2B) and (3).

Subclause 41(3):

Exemption from the requirements in subclauses 41(1) and (2).

Subclause 42(3):

Exemption from the requirements in subclauses 42(1) and (2).

Subclause 85(4):

Exemption from the requirement in subclause 85(1), insofar as it requires a pharmacist to only dispense a drug of addiction if the form of the prescription complies with the requirements in subclauses 80(2), (3) and (4).

Subclause 88(3):
Exemption from the requirements in subclauses 88(1) and (2).

Subclause 89(3):
Exemption from the requirements in subclauses 89(1) and (2).

2. Condition

The prescription must be issued for a person receiving residential care using an electronic medication order chart system:

- a) At an approved residential care service specified in the Schedule to the Special Arrangement, or
- b) Listed on the Transitional eNRM C Conformance Register maintained by the Australian Digital Health Agency.

3. Duration

This instrument expires on 31 May 2026 or when repealed by another instrument.

Approval: An authorised practitioner may use an electronic medication order chart system approved under the National Health (Electronic National Residential Medication Chart Trial) Special Arrangement 2018 (“Special Arrangement”) to give a written direction for the administration of a restricted substance or drug of addiction to a resident of a residential care facility approved for the purpose of the Special Arrangement.

Duration

This instrument expires on 31 May 2026 or when repealed by another instrument.
