AUTHORITY

Supply of Schedule 3 Poisons

I, DAVID NG, Chief Pharmacist, a duly appointed delegate of the Secretary, NSW Health, make this instrument pursuant to clause 170 of the *Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Regulation 2008* (NSW) [the Regulation] for the purpose of clause 17 of the Regulation. Pursuant to clause 171(1) of the Regulation, the authorisation is granted subject to conditions.

Authorisation to Supply Schedule 3 Poisons

1 Application

This instrument authorises the class of person to supply Schedule 3 poisons as listed in section 2 below for the treatment of opioid overdose.

2 Authorised Class of Person and Schedule 3 Poisons

Authorised class of person	Schedule 3 poisons
First Aider	Naloxone 1.8 mg nasal spray
	Naloxone 1 mg/mL prefilled syringe

3 Definitions

In this instrument:

- First Aider means a person who has a current statement of attainment in Apply First Aid and CPR granted by a Registered Training Organisation.
- Registered Training Organisation has the same meaning as in the National Vocational Education and Training Regulator Act 2011 (Cth).

4 Conditions

- a. An authorised First Aider may obtain by wholesale the Schedule 3 poison for the purpose of supply or administration to treat opioid overdose.
- b. Before administering naloxone, the First Aider must familiarise themselves with signs of an opioid overdose, and the directions on how to administer naloxone.

5 Validity

This Authority commences on the day it is signed and dated, and expires on 1 February 2026, or otherwise on a date that this Authority is varied, replaced or revoked.
