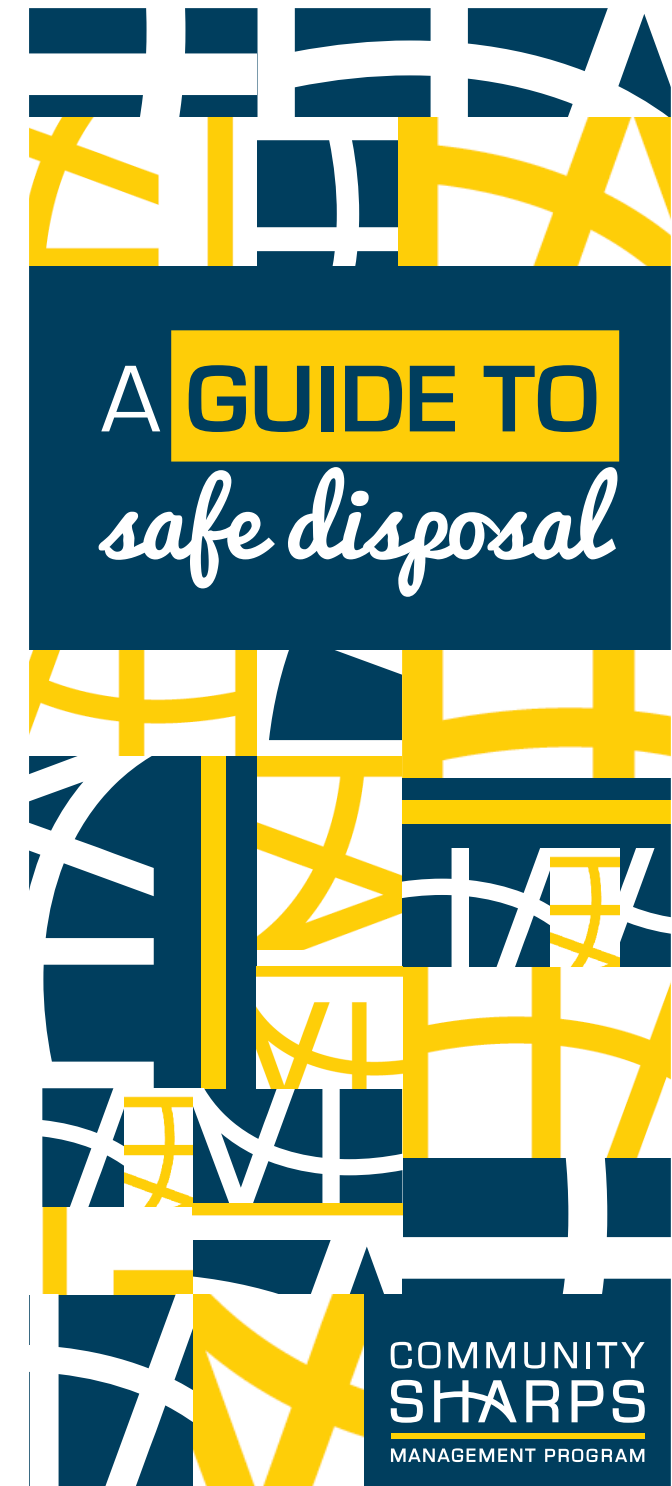

What are **Community Sharps**?

Community sharps are needles, syringes, pen needles, lancets and similar equipment used outside medical services, such as in homes.

Many people rely on using needles and syringes to maintain their health or that of a family member, for example.

How do I dispose of my **Community Sharps**?

To reduce the risk of harm to others as well as to our environment, **DO NOT** put sharps in your household waste, recycling bin or public litter bin.



DO use:

- an Australian Standard Sharps container
- a puncture proof plastic container with a lid (not glass or tin)
- a community sharps bin in a public toilet, at a public hospital or other disposal facility

Where is my nearest **Community Sharps** disposal bin?

All public hospitals in NSW provide a community sharps disposal service. **Contact your hospital for details.**

Many councils provide community sharps bins for residents to dispose of sharps containers. **Contact your local council to see what disposal services they offer.**

Facilities may also be available at pharmacies, local community health centres and Australian Diabetes Council Resource Centres.
