

NSW Health Care Interpreter Services



- Accurate communication is essential to providing health care that is safe and high quality.
- Patients, their families and carers who speak a language other than English have the right to free, confidential and professional interpreters when they use public health services in NSW.
- NSW Health provides interpreting services 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, onsite or by telephone and video, in over 120 languages, including Auslan.
- NSW Health has been providing professional health care interpreting services for more than 45 years. NSW Health is the largest employer of interpreters in NSW. We have a unique model of providing interpreting services through five NSW Health Care Interpreter Services (HCIS), as shown in the maps below.
- When linguistically diverse patients access public health care services, HCIS provide life enhancing, and at times life-saving, communication supports to ensure accessible, safe and high quality health care services for linguistically diverse communities in NSW.

- Health care interpreters and translators provide a critical clinical support service, which is essential to ensure accessible, safe and high quality health care services for linguistically diverse communities in NSW.
- HCIS are hosted by local health districts and employ a permanent staff of more than 200 FTE highly skilled professionally certified interpreters, and also engage up to a thousand sessional interpreters each year to provide language services.
