- 1. Approval of projected/actual expenditure associated with the tender must be given under Delegation F2.
- 2. Subject to any exception approved by the Chief Procurement Officer, there must be compliance with NSW Health Procurement (Goods and Services) Policy Directive PD2024\_027 as issued from time to time and all NSW Procurement Board directions and policies, including the NSW Government Procurement Policy Framework.
- 3. Where the Health Administration Corporation is the contracting party, it must be described in the Agreement as: "HAC is entering into this agreement in the exercise of a function of the Secretary of the NSW Ministry of Health pursuant to a determination made under section 8A of the Health Administration Act 1982."

#### Part 3: Conditions

- 1. Delegates have authority to execute a grant agreement subject to a grant approval having previously been granted by the Minister for Health or delegate with an appropriate financial delegation refer to delegation F11.
- 2. The power to execute a grant agreement includes the power to vary a grant agreement, provided that the change in scope does not amount to a new grant. The NSW Grants Administration Guide (as issued September 2022 and amended from time to time), and any applicable NSW Health policy directives, provide guidance as to the circumstances in which a change in a funded project should be regarded as either a permissible variation or a new grant requiring a fresh approval.

#### Part 4: Notes

- 1. This delegation applies to all grant types, including Ministerially approved grants under the Non Government Organisation (NGO) Grant program, Program Grants, Ad Hoc Grants, Recruitment and Scholarship Grants.
- 2. This delegation F12 is to be relied upon exclusively for the execution of funding agreements. Ministry branches are not to seek delegation from the Minister for the execution of funding agreements as part of any brief to the Minister seeking approval for a grant.
- 3. An officer with responsibility for managing a grant may approve payments subject to funds being available and compliance with any conditions of the grant.

# ENTERING INTO FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS UNDER THE GOVERNMENT SECTOR FINANCE ACT

#### Part 1: Power/Function Delegated:

Enter into the following types of financial arrangement for and on behalf of a NSW Health entity, where authorised under the Government Sector Finance Act:

- a) a borrowing,
- b) an investment,
- c) a derivative arrangement.

#### Part 3: Conditions

1. Compliance with such policies or directions that may be issued from time to time by the Treasurer or NSW Treasury.

#### Part 4: Notes

- 1. "NSW Health entity" is defined in s2.3 of the Government Sector Finance Act, and includes local health districts, speciality health networks, Pillar organisations (including Cancer Institute) and the Health Administration Corporation.
- 2. A delegate can enter into a financial arrangement only if:
  - (a) the arrangement for the agency is authorised, and
  - (b) the terms and conditions of the authorisation are complied with (s6.22(1) of Government Sector Finance Act)
- 3. A financial arrangement is authorised only if:
  - (a) the arrangement is authorised or permitted by a provision of the Act, the Government Sector Finance Regulation 2018 or the Treasurer's directions, or
  - (b) the Treasurer has given a written approval (known as a "financial arrangement approval") to:
    - (i) enter into the financial arrangement, or
    - (ii) enter into financial arrangements of the same kind as the financial arrangement. (s6.22(2) of the Government Sector Finance Act)
- 4. This delegation only permits a delegate to enter into the types of financial arrangements listed in Part 1. It does not apply to any other type of financial arrangement listed in section 6.22 of the GSF Act.
